

Summary of Minutes  
Regular Board Meeting  
Wednesday, May 9, 2012

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The Board of Education of the Wilkes-Barre Area School District held a Regular Board Meeting on Wednesday, May 9, 2012. **President, Maryanne W. Toole** called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

**Superintendent Dr. Jeffrey T. Namey** led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**Board Secretary Leonard B. Przywara** called the roll.

2. Jack Nolan, 42 Lawrence Street, Wilkes-Barre, PA  
Mr. Nolan, Varsity Head Soccer Coach at Meyers High School, addressed the board in regard to the poor conditions of some of the soccer fields the teams (Varsity/ Jr. High) are using. Mr. Nolan asked if it would be possible to schedule games at Wilkes-Barre Memorial Stadium more frequently. Mr. Nolan did note that the field would need to be lined for soccer and that they would be permanent lines.

President Toole requested that Ms. Evans Chairperson of the Athletic Committee along with the other members of the Athletic Committee, determine if it would be possible to schedule additional soccer games at Wilkes-Barre Memorial Stadium and also determine the cost of lining the field for soccer. President Toole requested that when that information is available, the Athletic Committee provide a report to the Board as to their recommendations.

Ms. Hughes addressed the Board on the following items.

Ms. Hughes inquired as to the status of a Forensic Audit in regard to bills submitted to the District by Anthony J. Lupas.
  - d. SFA Reading Program  
Ms. Hughes expressed to the Board and Dr. Namey her belief that the SFA Reading Program was not beneficial to the students of the Wilkes-Barre Area School District and that the majority of teachers were unhappy with the program.

Dr. Corcoran responded to Ms. Hughes regarding the Hiring Policy. Dr. Corcoran informed Ms. Hughes that an Ad Hoc Hiring Policy Committee was established by President Toole. Dr. Corcoran stated that he is the Chair of the Ad Hoc Hiring Policy Committee and the Committee has been meeting twice a month and presenting updated reports on progress to the Board. Dr. Corcoran further stated he hoped to present a completed Hiring Policy recommendation to the Board in the near future for the Boards consideration and approval.

President Toole asked Mr. Serafini to check on the procedures regarding recycling within the District and to ensure that the Custodial staff is following the proper procedures.

President Toole responded to Ms. Hughes in regard to the Forensic Audit. Mrs. Toole stated that the Forensic Audit will be addressed at this evening's Board Meeting (May 9, 2012).

Dr. Namey responded to Ms. Hughes in regard to her questions and concerns regarding SFA.

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President Toole informed Ms. Hughes that the Board is going to meet with randomly selected teachers and ask them to speak candidly regarding the SFA Reading Program.

**Communication from Superintendent**

Dr. Namey presented the following statement to the Board and all present at the Regular Board Meeting of May 9, 2012.

I had always hoped that when I ended my career, there would be peace and tranquility in my work environment.

Unfortunately, I have come to realize that there will never be a tranquil time in this setting. It is with great sadness that I announce that I am retiring as Superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre Area School District effective August 31, 2012.

I have been honored and blessed to have been given the opportunity to serve the students of this wonderful school District for 42 years. I have had the opportunity to work with many caring and dedicated board members, administrators, teachers, secretaries, custodians and other members of our school district family.

I have come to realize how quickly the years are passing and in light of recent health concerns, now is the time for me to turn my attention to my children, grandchildren and all family members, who have supported and encouraged me and have sacrificed the most these past years. I will never forget the support given me by our board of education and all those who stood by my side these many years. It was this support and mutual respect that enabled our district to provide outstanding educational services and programs to our students. To our parents, please know I never forgot our district's commitment and obligation to your sons and daughters, your most precious possessions. Thank you for your support and encouragement. The Wilkes-Barre Area School District, its staff and students have been a major part of my life and I will miss them terribly. Thank you.

Miss Katsock informed the Board that she has made available an Access Review Sheet for the 2011-2012 school year for the Board to review. Miss Katsock stated that the Access sheet shows the District's projected balance thru March, noting that April, May and June is not completed as yet. Miss Katsock further stated that she wished to make the Board aware of the fact that LIU #18 is the only IU in the state that returns 95 % of the Access money that it collects. Miss Katsock noted that LIU # 18 does the work and takes very little money for the work they do.

**WILKES-BARRE AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL CENTER**

**WHEREAS**, Pennsylvania's more than 1.8 million public school students deserve the highest quality education; and maintaining and supporting a 'thorough and efficient system' of public education is a constitutional obligation of the commonwealth; and

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**WHEREAS**, it is the responsibility of the Board of Directors of the \_\_\_\_\_ School District to provide for the education of its students in a manner that enables them to be college and career-ready upon graduation; and

**WHEREAS**, increases in recent years in state investment in K-12 education has resulted in sustained improvement in academic performance for students, as evidenced by these facts that show that Pennsylvania's public schools are succeeding:

- Pennsylvania currently ranks 7th among the 50 states for K-12 student achievement and 13th overall in a national report released in January 2012; and
- Pennsylvania's 2011 PSSA scores show that 94% of public school districts reached targets for Adequate Yearly Progress as required under the federal No Child Left Behind Act;
- The number of Pennsylvania public high school students taking and testing in an Advanced Placement course continues to increase each year, and the numbers of Pennsylvania students scoring a 3+ on AP exams continues to grow each year. **WHEREAS**, it is critical for Pennsylvania to continue to make smart investments that improve the ability of our students to compete in the high-skills global economy without shifting the burden to the local property taxpayers; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2012-13 state budget maintains basic education funding at 2008-09 levels, maintains level funding for special education for the fourth consecutive year although the costs for providing such mandated services continues to rise, and eliminates the Accountability Block Grant program; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2012-13 proposed state budget for K-12 education does not restore funds eliminated in the 2011-12 budget for charter school reimbursement, school improvement grants; education assistance programs, elementary science programs, and dual enrollment programs; and

**WHEREAS**, expectations and requirements for students do not diminish in times of economic difficulty, as exemplified by the need for school districts to meet rising targets in 2012 for proficiency on PSSA assessments, implement curriculum aligned with new Common Core standards, increase graduation requirements and administer Keystone Exams; and

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**WHEREAS**, no increases in K-12 education funding actually is a net loss for public education considering increases in costs out of the control of school boards, including pensions, prevailing wage requirements, unreimbursed charter school costs, rising healthcare and energy costs, and more; and

**WHEREAS**, the continued reduction of state funding for basic education further shifts the burden to the local property taxpayers and provide no mandate relief to school districts as a way of controlling costs; and

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the \_\_\_\_\_ School District strongly urges the General Assembly to take legislative action in the 2012-13 state budget to increase funding for K-12 education. Such increases include, at a minimum, additional funding for the basic education and special education subsidies, and restoration of funding for charter school reimbursement and Accountability Block Grants.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this district also urges the General Assembly to take action on meaningful mandate reform by the time the new 2012-13 state budget is enacted and
