PARENT CONFERENCE TIPS

PARENTS — DON'T FORGET TO TELL THE TEACHER......

Sharing important information about your child is key in helping teacher's understand your child. No one knows more about your child than you do. Plan to share issues that may affect school performance. Students do best when parents and teachers work together as partners. Tell the teacher about:

- Health conditions: Let your child's teacher know about medical conditions that might affect learning. Yes, even if your child wears glasses or takes any medication.
- *Family issues:* Let your child's teacher know about major changes that could affect your child, such as divorce, death in the family, move, etc.
- *Personality traits for behavior issues:* Does your child have discipline problems at home or worry about making new friends?
- Strengths and weaknesses: Does your child have difficulty concentrating? Does he/she struggle with reading, math or other subjects? If you tell teachers these things up front, they'll have more time to help your child improve in these areas.
