

Which State is It? - Art Project - Grades 3-8

Read the clues, then lift the flap to see if you guessed right!

This project can be used to review any of a variety of facts about individual states or the United States of America.

Materials Needed:

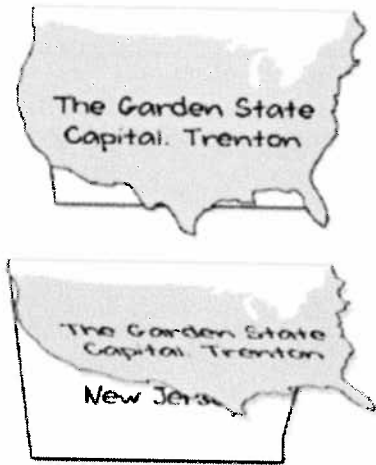
USA shape printouts, crayons, markers or colored pencils, scissors

Directions:

For this example, we'll use state facts for the project.

- 1) Have the students pick (or assign) a state. Let them know what sort of information to use for the clues – clues can be very simple like listing the capital of the state, or they can be more complex.
- 2) Cut out the printout. Fold on the line. Color the USA shape if desired. Write the clue(s) on the front and the answer inside.

The finished projects can be passed around from one student to the next for each to read the clues and then guess. They can also be mounted on a bulletin board, and the students can take turns quizzing themselves.



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
