Parent Tips for School Success

PARENT TIPS: Homework

Purposes of Homework

Knowing about homework assignments can involve parents in the schooling process in a positive way and accelerate a child's learning. It can give parents firsthand information about what students are learning and how well their child is doing in school. It can also give them an opportunity to express supportive attitudes about the value of success in school. Talking with teachers about homework can help parents understand what is expected of students and generally improve communication between the family and the school. If a child is having difficulty with homework, parents should become involved by discussing the issue with the teacher and asking how they might help.

- *Practice:* Assignments are made to increase speed, obtain mastery, or maintain skills. Examples include reviewing multiplication tables, studying spelling words, or practicing poetry.
- *Preparation:* Assignments are made to prepare students for future classroom activities. Students, for example, might be asked to read two chapters on a social studies topic an be prepared to participate in a class debate.
- *Extenstion:* Assignments are made to extend and enrich a student's classroom learning. Students would be asked to apply knowledge and skills learned during class to related project-like activities.
