Parent Tips for School Success

Parent /Teacher Conference Month!
 * Tips for a Productive Meeting *

Parent-teacher conferences are a constant throughout your child's education. Not every conference will be the same. Here is a helpful checklist for you to use before you go!

 Talk to your child BEFORE the conference to find out what they love about school this year and to surface any concerns or issues.

 Ask questions such as: What are my child's strengths? Challenges? Does my child participate in class? Does my child seem happy at school? Does my child work well in groups? Does my child seem challenged by the classwork?

- Be on time (early)
- Turn off or silence your phone
- End the meeting on time
- Ask if the teacher needs parent volunteer support?
- Ask for specific examples of clarification of anything your don't understand!
