Parent Tips for School Success


Helping your child succeed in School

Start the new school year with strategies for academic success!

How you start the school year can determine how well the rest of the year will go. Here's how to make sure your child gets off to a great start this year.

- Review school safety. Talk to your child about the importance of following school rules. Also talk about ways to be safe when riding the school bus or walking to school.
- Get to know your child's teacher. When parents and teachers are on the same team, kids do better in school.
 Once you've met face to face, you'll find it easier to ask a question or share a concern.
- Set Goals. Students who do best in school have both short— and long-term goals. Whether its earning an A in math or preparing to become a veterinarian, your child needs goals to keep him on the right track.
- Settle into a routine. Kids thrive on predictability. So
 have a regular time for homework. Set-and stick to— a
 regular bedtime. Plan a morning routine that gets everyone out the door on time.
- Don't overschedule your child. Give him time to unwind after school-especially during the first few weeks.
- Be genuinely interested. In your child's schoolwork. Ask him about school everyday.
- Insist that your child. Give their best effort in school. If your child knows that school is important to you, it will be important to him.
