Whose Hat? - Art Project - Grades K-2

Flip the pages to change the hats.

Preparation:

Discuss hats and how they are used for protection and identification. This can be linked to discussion of various community helpers.

Materials Needed:

Printouts, crayons or colored pencils, scissors, stapler

Directions:

- 1) Color the dog on the full page.
- 2) Color the various hat/head squares, and cut them out. Fold them on the line.
- 3) Stack the hat pictures, and then align them with the box on the dog picture.
- 4) Staple the hat pictures to the base picture in the narrow top rectangle.

Note: Some of the hats pictured might apply to a variety of jobs; the policeman style hat (in this project drawn with a badge) might also be worn by crossing guards, military, or postal workers. Baseball style caps are often part of uniforms for repairmen, postal workers, gardeners, farmers, sanitation workers and others. The brimmed hat could be seen as a cowboy hat, fedora (reporters or businessmen), farmer's hat, or Boy Scout troop leader's hat.
